


The Arran: Wild and Free

Driving

Sites of natural, rugged beauty to marvel at throughout Arran



This tour is 70 miles long, please allow at least 2 hours 45 minutes to complete it, excluding the time taken to enjoy the destinations along the way.

This route showcases the sheer variety of landscapes visitors can experience on Arran. Hike the glorious Glen Rosa valley and soak in the majesty of the surrounding Corbetts, before attempting the summit of Goatfell – Arran’s highest point. The pebbled beaches of Pirnmill provide a peaceful contrast to the crashing drama of the mountainous waterfalls at Glenashdale and Eas Mor. Wherever you decide to start your Wild and Free tour, there are spectacular sights at every stop.
