# Westfield shopping centres

From designer boutiques to department stores, Westfield London shopping centre in White City/Shepherds Bush is the ultimate one-stop shopping destination. The only inner-city retail complex in England to rival its magnitude is sister centre Westfield Stratford City, which opened in 2011. Overlooking the Olympic Park, this new East London shopping hub also houses the UK's largest casino. ### 2 Clarks Village, Somerset

#### The Shambles, York
