Dunnottar Castle

Dunnottar was an impregnable fortress that holds many rich secrets of Scotland's colourful past.

The dramatic and evocative ruined cliff top fortress was the home of the Earls Marischal, once one of the most powerful families in the land. William Wallace, Mary Queen of Scots, the Marquis of Montrose and the future King Charles II have graced the Castle with their presence.

It's most recent famous visitor was Mel Gibson whilst on location filming Hamlet.

Suggested time: 1 hour

Cliff top walk to Stonehaven

Offering spectacular views down to Stonehaven Harbour, where the Highland Fault line meets the sea.

Suggested time: 30 - 40 mins
